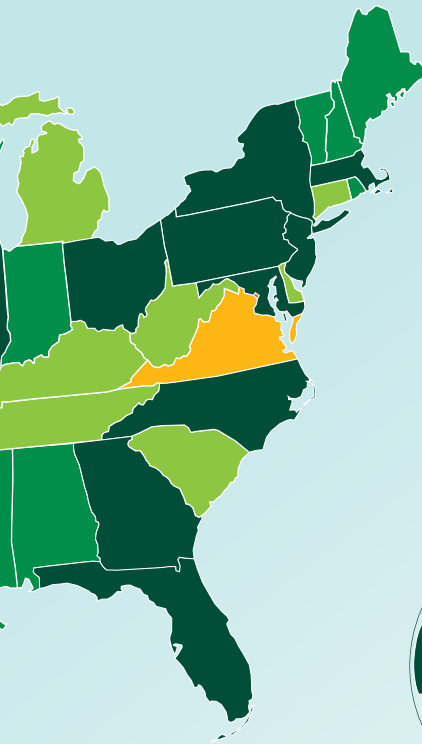

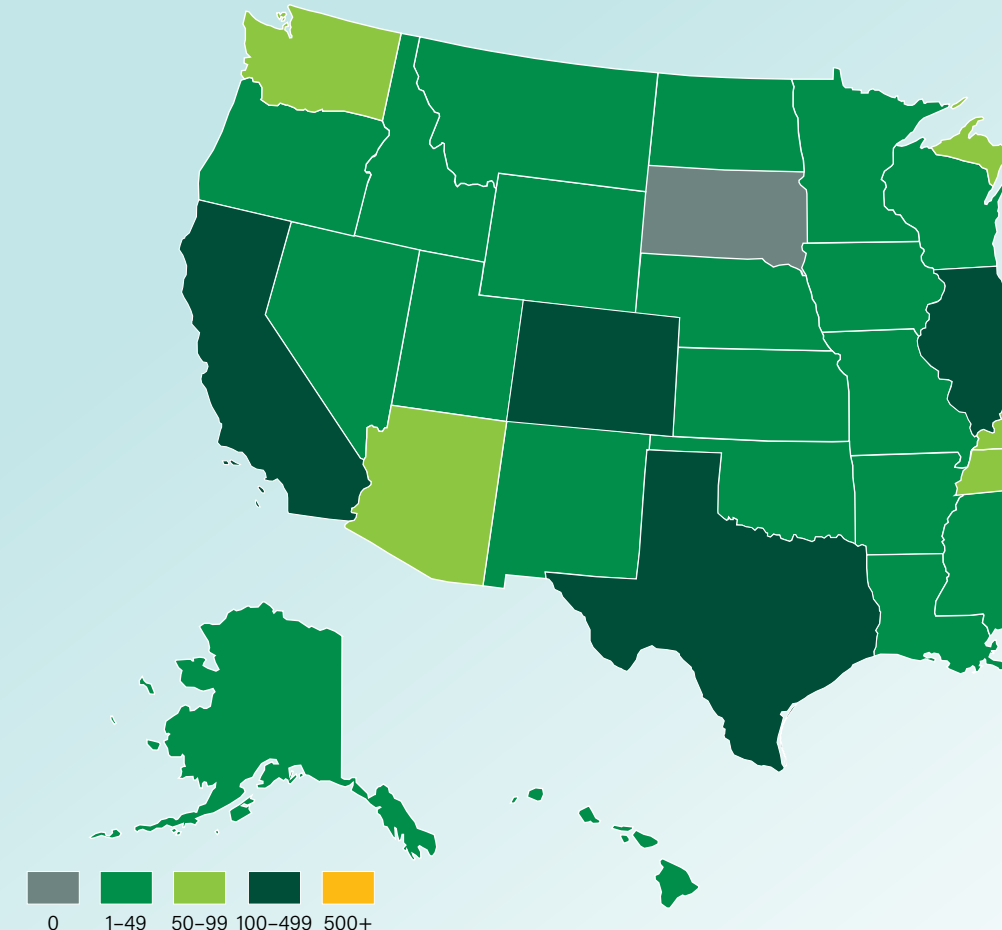
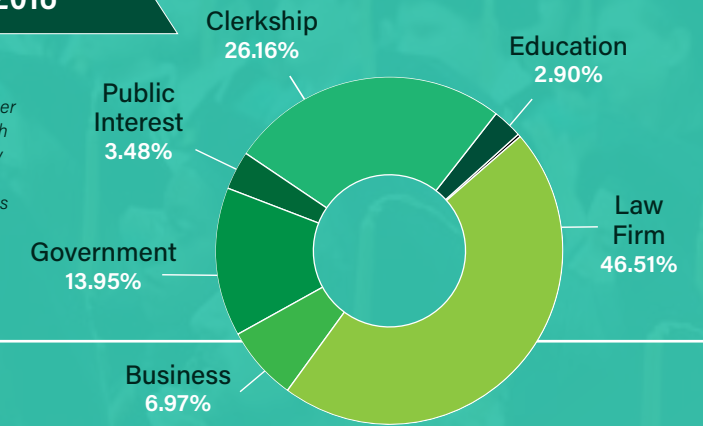

## SCHOLARSHIPS & FINANCIAL AID

William & Mary Law School awards merit-based scholarships in amounts up to full tuition. More than 90% of the student body currently has a scholarship helping to fund their legal education. As an applicant, you are automatically considered for William & Mary Law scholarships upon submitting your application for admission. Students who apply through the Early Decision program will be considered for a full-tuition scholarship upon admission.

William & Mary Law School does not have a required GPA to maintain scholarships — as long as you are within good academic standing, your scholarship will not be reduced or eliminated.
